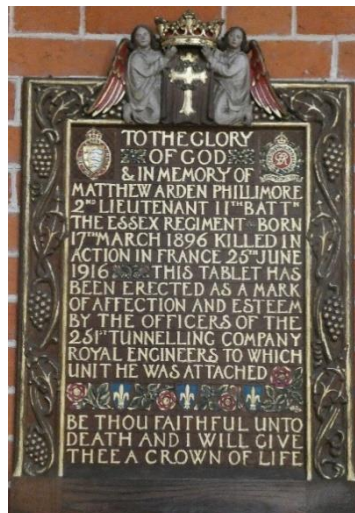

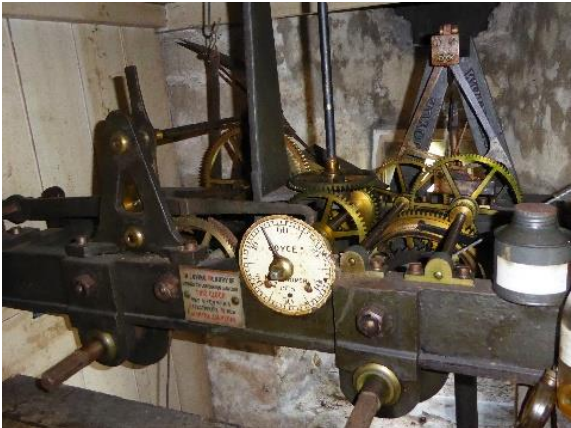

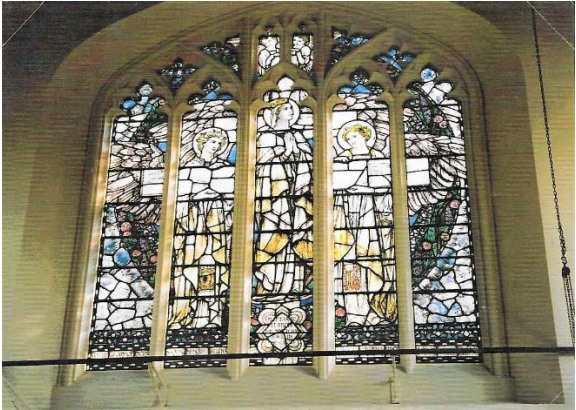


What is this made of?
