Bamburgh Castle

Nottingham Castle

A Stuart restoration-era mansion, Nottingham Castle was built on the site of a Norman castle and was added to in the Medieval and Victorian periods. Showcasing Nottingham's local crafts including lacemaking and pottery, the castle's galleries display a fascinating range of artefacts and incredible works of art. The artistic highlight is the castle's Long Gallery, dating back to 1878, featuring a mix of paintings, sculptures, drawings, ceramics, textiles and jewellery.

Durham Cathedral

The grandiose city of Durham is packed with fascinating history and architecture. The centre is overlooked by a majestic cathedral and ancient castle: set on a rocky promontory above the city, these icons form one of the first World Heritage Sites and present an imposing profile. The stunning 11th century cathedral displays Romanesque traits.

Bowes Museum

Home to internationally significant collections of fine and decorative arts, the Bowes Museum dates back to the 19th century. The diverse collections span three floors of this magnificent French-style chateau.

Tour of Newcastle

The former Baltic Flour Mills has been converted into the Baltic Centre for Contemporary Art with its vast space, ideal for hosting specialist & unique collections, including live & interactive installations. A grade II listed building, the Laing Art Gallery focuses on both modern and classical British art, from oil and watercolour to ceramics and glassware as well as important international artists such as Gauguin, Henry Moore and William Holman-Hunt. The contemporary sculpture, 'Angel of the North' made of steel reflects the area's ship building heritage.



Durham Cathedral

Lindisfarne Priory

Located on the tiny tidal Holy Island, this 16th century castle is a magical place. It was converted into a private holiday home for Edward Hudson, the founder of Country Life magazine. Today it is owned by the National Trust and open to visitors to explore its summer flowering garden, designed by Gertrude Jekyll and shoreline walks with Victorian Limekilns. Inside the rooms are a delight to wander through.

Bamburgh Castle

This imposing fortress gazes out across the North Sea and is a symbol of Northumbria's proud history. The site of Bamburgh has witnessed brutal history dating back to pre-historic times, and the castle was a casualty of the War of the Roses. It was rescued from ruin during the Victorian era by the industrialist Lord Armstrong.

Alnwick Castle & The Alnwick Garden

This illustrious 14th century castle is the Duke of Northumberland's ancestral home. The mighty fortress is as impressive inside as out, with lavish state rooms and a splendid display of Italian artworks. The Alnwick Garden is a unique and contemporary garden that was built to be different and includes an array of fascinating aspects, from the Bamboo Labyrinth and the Poison Garden to the mesmerising Grand Cascade. Transforming across the seasons, there is still a nod to the garden's history with the more traditional Ornamental and Rose gardens.

Temple Newsam

The impressive Temple Newsam, a Tudor-Jacobean mansion offers a fascinating insight into the past residents who lived and worked here, including Lord Darnley, the second husband of Mary, Queen of Scots. Browse collections with over 40 rooms and extensive grounds and gardens landscaped by famed 18th century gardener, Capability Brown.

Newcastle Gateshead Marriott Hotel & Radisson Blu Durham

The 4 star Marriott Gateshead hotel has well-appointed and stylish en suite hotel rooms. There is a bar & the restaurant, offers a varied menu prepared using only seasonal local produce. The hotel also has an indoor pool.



The 4* Radisson Blu Hotel, Durham overlooks the River Wear, and is located in the city centre. Stylishly decorated rooms are spacious and contemporary and there is a large, modern restaurant with a view over the river. Leisure facilities include an indoor swimming pool.
